INFECTIOUS DISEASES

I am asking all parents to support Ryan whilst he is receiving treatment, which results in a lowered immune system, which means, that Ryan is more prone to getting ill from infections. As Ryan is not contagious but has a chronic illness, it is important he participates actively in the day to day school program without any major limitations. A major concern is that if Ryan develops measles, chickenpox, whooping cough or influenza, he could become seriously ill. I seek your cooperation in preventing this situation.

If your child has or may have measles, chicken pox or other infectious illness, I would ask that you please:

- 1) Do not send them to school.
- 2) Notify me as soon as possible.
- 3) Take them to your GP or medical centre to confirm diagnosis if possible

I wish to thank you in anticipation for your support.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE CONTINUED

ASSEMBLY 2018:

Commencing on Monday of Week 2, our weekly assembly previously scheduled on Thursday mornings, will now move to Monday mornings. This assembly will be led by our school leaders, as was the case last year. In this way, the school community will gather together to start off the week. These assemblies with be short in length, to ensure that learning time is maximised. The structure for these assemblies will be:

Greeting, Prayer and National Anthem. Birthdays will be acknowledged in the classroom with a birthday ribbon and children's names will be specified in the fortnightly school newsletter.

Every three weeks the school will be holding a <u>CELEBRATION OF LEARNING ASSEMBLY</u>. The purpose of these assemblies is to provide parents with a glimpse of the learning taking place in the classrooms. On a roster basis, each grade will present at one of these assemblies. The structure will be as follows: Greeting, prayer, Showcase of learning and any announcements. We encourage parents, carers and friends to join us for these celebrations. Our Year 6 students will be the first to present a Celebration Assembly on Friday 16th February, at 2:15pm. The assemblies will take place at 2:15pm on Fridays - Week 3, 5, 7 and 10. Please note that this arrangement is for this term and will be changed in Term 2 to provide different parents the opportunity to attend when the day is changed.

Commencing this week the Bethany Newsletter will go out to the community on each ODD week of the term - Weeks 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11.

BETHANY SAFE AND SUPPORTIVE POLICY:

At Bethany we endeavour to ensure that our school is a safe and supportive environment for all students. To ensure that this happens a balanced approach is in place for reinforcing positive behaviours and managing inappropriate behaviours. Expectations are set on the classroom and whole school level. The behavioural expectations at Bethany are that all students are: Respectful and Safe Learners.

When these expectations are compromised we have in place a process known as RED SLIPS. Red slips are discipline records which note the inappropriate behaviours both in the classrooms and on the play-ground.

Below are the guidelines on the Red Slip:

Behaviours which are in categories 1 to 4 are reported to Stage Coordinators and repeated offences from categories 5 to 12 are both followed up with phone calls to parents and carers. All investigations carried out by staff follow the process of procedural fairness.

The above procedure is shared in this year's first Newsletter to keep all parents well informed. We encourage you to have a conversation with your child about the process outlined to promote a collaborative and proactive approach between home and school.

Looking forward at 2018, more positive and rewarding systems, such as the Principal's Morning Tea will be reinforced.

LITERACY - Mrs Baldacchino

In 2018, our literacy school goal is:

For all students to demonstrate improved comprehension with a focus on knowledge about language.

Why this goal?

Comprehension and spelling development have been areas of focus in recent years at Bethany. This goal aims to continue to bring these two areas of focus together. During shared reading and writing lessons, teachers will monitor student development of comprehension through questioning and student responses to texts. The focus on knowledge about language, which incorporates the areas of spelling, vocabulary and grammar, will provide further opportunities for students to develop comprehension skills.

The 2018 school year began with each grade reading a letter from Mrs Brown during shared reading lessons. The students were given an opportunity to respond to Mrs Brown's letter during writing lessons. Through this initial written response, teachers were able to obtain a base for how to assist each student to work towards achieving our school literacy goal. Students will have further opportunities over the coming week to improve upon their written response to Mrs Brown, and focus on improving their knowledge about language and comprehension.

Numeracy News

A very warm welcome back to all students and their families. I wish to thank all those families who have been successful in having their children sit the Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) in the first few days of school. It is a diocesan requirement that all students are interviewed. If your child has not had the interview rest assured your child's teacher will be administering the MAI over the next few days here at school.

The MAI is a clinical interview with a research based framework of growth points, that describe key stages in the learning of nine mathematics domains. Here at Bethany we focus on four of the domains:

- Counting
- Place value
- Addition & subtraction
- Multiplication & division

The MAI provides insights into children's current mathematical thinking. The growth point framework is a research based learning trajectory that teachers can use to establish where students are and where to next. They are major checkpoints in children's mathematical thinking and use of strategies. Growth points are useful because they help teachers:

- Understand how children learn;
- Assess and monitor children's growth in understanding;
- Identify children who are at risk;
- Plan & target teaching so that teachers can identify the experiences that will most effectively help children achieve the next growth point in their mathematical learning.

Improving the learning outcomes of students is the heart of all we do and we look forward to working with you and your children in 2018.



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BUS APPLICATIONS

Applications for 2018 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) and Term Bus Pass (TBP) travel entitlements are now open.

In coming days students who hold an SSTS entitlement and are changing grade bands i.e. going from year 2 to 3 or year 6 to 7 and changing school, and students whose entitlement was approved under a medical condition, will receive notification by email or post informing them of the pending expiry of their entitlement. TBP holders will also receive notification.

Students enquiring about pending cancellation should be advised to go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails to update details/make application for next year's entitlement.

Application needs to be made before 31 December 2017 to ensure their entitlement is updated and their current card is not cancelled. If application is made after the expiry of their entitlement (31 December) the system will automatically cancel their card and a new one will need to be issued.

Please note: Students who are changing grade band and are <u>remaining at the same school</u> will not receive notification and <u>do not need to reapply</u> (the system now automatically validates a student's on-going eligibility if at the same school and going from infants to primary or primary to secondary). Where a student meets the new eligibility the system will automatically update their entitlement and card.

Students in the Opal area applying for a SSTS or TBP entitlement for the first time will receive their card (posted to the nominated address) a week or two before the commencement of 2018 classes. Please let students know new cards for 2018 are not posted in 2017 or during the Christmas / New Year period.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas are expected to receive their new travel pass at the commencement of the New School Year. **Note**; not all R&R operators issue passes (often in smaller communities where the student is known a pass is not issued).
