- a stronger belief in the importance of education


We look forward to working with all parents and carers in building a positive and effective school and parent partnership at Bethany.

Staff Professional Learning

Effective professional development serves to identify student learning needs. It focuses on the relationship between teaching and student learning. Time spent out of class and in professional learning allows teachers to collaborate and discuss students' data in order to make informed decisions about future learning. Throughout this week, all classroom teachers were provided an additional 2 hours of professional learning time as a grade team. This gave them the opportunity to look at student samples, pre-assessments and to plan appropriately for the students' needs.

Below is the Religious Education Agreed Practice. Every grade / class from Kindergarten to Year 6 follow the same Agreed Practice no matter which unit / content is being taught. This is the same as in Mathematics and Literacy.

All Catholic primary schools in the Parramatta Diocese follow a similar practice.

With the trial of the new RE Framework, there may be some amendments made to the practice throughout the year. We will endeavour to inform parents when changes are made.

Students will engage with interactive word walls. Teachers will support learning with the use of current resources that promote religious literacy eg. Understanding Faith website, Senses of Scripture, Exploring Scripture, Scriptural meditation, To Know, Worship and Love, CEDP Mission Google + page etc. Direct teaching may be supported by opportunities to integrate Religious Education in other Key Learning Areas, such as English. Student learning will be enriched by observable teacher use of unit Theological Background. 					
REFLECTION TIME	 3-5 minute Reflection Time that includes opportunities to; refer back to visible learning intentions and success criteria. address any misunderstandings or extend student thinking. 					
ASSESSMENT	 All unit assessment will be developed with 'the end in mind'. Students will participate in pre and post testing of Five Fast Facts / Fast Facts generated before the teaching of a unit pathway - may focus on key concepts / scripture. Results for these will be recorded. Pre / Mid / Post Testing of units of work (depending on unit length Assessment OF, FOR & AS for each outcome assessed 					



Numeracy - Mrs Donlan

All students attending Bethany have now completed the Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI). Last year I explained that the MAI was developed from an extensive Australian research base of 30,000 interviews from the Early Years Numeracy Research Project (1999-2001), conducted by the Australian Catholic University and Monash University.

The MAI consists of four number domains and five measurement domains.

As previously mentioned, it is current practice in the Diocese of Parramatta for K-6 class teachers to complete the four number domains on each student at the beginning of the school year.

The 'On the Way' Growth Points are used by classroom teachers and EMU specialist teachers to identify students who are vulnerable in one or more number domains. This information is used to prioritise students for placement in EMU intervention groups.

In addition, this data from the MAI's is currently being analysed by teachers in each of the grades to create a '2019 Numeracy Goal' that is specific to the grade. This will mean that grades can plan & target teaching so that teachers can identify the experiences that will most effectively help children achieve the next growth point in their mathematical learning.

Once goals have been established, each of the grade's numeracy goal for 2019 will be communicated.

ATTENDANCE

\$100 CREATIVE KIDS VOUCHERS GO LIVE

As parents begin planning for the year ahead, they can now access Creative Kids vouchers, providing them with \$100 for every school-age child to help cover the cost of enrolment for creative and cultural learning activities. Parents can use one voucher for every school-age child per year to help meet the cost of structured creative and cultural activities, such as music lessons, languages, coding, drama and theatre, photography and graphic design. Minister for Finance, Services and Property Victor Dominello said the NSW Government's Creative Kids program builds on the success of the Active Kids program, which is back this year, helping to reduce the cost of registration for sport and organised physical activity.
