We return from an atypical term break each with different experiences and perspectives on life under the challenge of Covid-19. Amidst this new reality has come opportunities for solitude, prayer, music, drawing, meditation, baking, cooking, gardening, sewing, woodworking, cleaning, walking, reading, over-indulging in TV series and other family time.

We are also acutely aware of the human effect of the pandemic on our community and our nation - the tragic loss of life, serious illness, mental anxiety, social isolation, ongoing stress, loss of regular employment and the financial strain that this brings families.

One **silver lining** of our new reality is a greater appreciation of the importance of human connection and of community.

Our society has also gained a greater appreciation of the centrality of certain people and occupations and their critical contribution **to the greater good** – **grandparents, doctors, nurses, medical researchers, scientists, supermarket staff, warehouse workers, food process workers, truck drivers, farmers, postal couriers, teachers just to name a few.**



We have a greater sense that as humans we are **interconnected social creatures - needing each other to survive and thrive.** This imposed period of physical isolation has forced us to look for different ways to maintain connection with our families, neighbours and friends. Modern technology has enabled this to occur to a great degree, but we pine for more. Anzac Day is a perfect example of this. Unable to gather in large groups, our sense of national ritual was expressed through commemorations at the end of our driveways.

Ralph Waldo Emerson once wrote, **The mind, once stretched by a new idea, never returns to its original dimensions.** So, by paying attention to the profound lessons of this time, we can have hope that we will not remain the same after the crisis eventually passes. We **WILL** be changed and conceivably, be better for the experience.

In essence what this time brings to us is an opportunity to focus on the **PEOPLE** in our life - our relationships with others. This is ultimately, what brings our life meaning and joy.

Family and Prayer

Many words have been used to describe the current situation our world faces today - unprecedented, ever-changing, challenging, disconcerting and the list goes on. More than ever before, and certainly in my lifetime, the FAMILY unit is under the spotlight. With families being forced into isolation many have become very creative with their time together. Just some of the activities that families are engaging in together are: walking, cooking, playing board games, meal time. But what about PRAYER?

Among many things, as Catholics we are called to evangelise to the greater community. And what better time to disciple and to stimulate love and good works than NOW and in our homes. A number of research sources point to a drop in faith practice when children become young adults. But what is more alarming is that 40% of these young adults reported their first doubts and questions of faith at the approximate age of 12.

The basis of our church stems from the FAMILY. Figuratively the church is often referred to as the church family. Similarly God is referred to as the Father and our counterparts as brothers and sisters in Christ. When we are baptised, we refer to this as the welcome into God's Family. None of us are saved 'by association'. God calls us all into relationship with Him.

So this Easter season I invite you to spend time in prayer, as a family. I encourage you to put time aside, just as you would for baking and other activities, to pray. This does not need to be in formal prayer but a conversation with your children about God. Alternatively, if formal prayer is a more comfortable practice for you then I invite you to recite an Our Father or Hail Mary as a family. You may even want to light a candle to create this space for God. On the following page is a prayer that you may choose to recite together at this time.


2020 Premier Reading Challenge Changes

Students on all Challenge levels are able to read 10 choice books.


Students on all Challenge levels will be able to include books on their reading records that they read collaboratively as a class, in person or online with their teacher or at home with their parents/carers.


