Dear Bethany Families,

The Conferences provide a wonderful opportunity for parents, students and teachers to discuss and celebrate effort and progress in learning as well as goal-setting for next semester.

The inclusion of students in these Conferences is incredibly beneficial and powerful in strengthening the purpose of these meetings - <u>they are, after all, about</u> <u>them and their learning.</u>

As we enter into this time of celebrating the learning gains made by each student I am reminded of **Albert Einstein** who once said that he did not believe that he was that smart, but he did believe that he was **passionately curious**.





This **curiosity is at the heart of all good learning.** Our collective job is to **model, encourage** and **foster** this spirit of curiosity. Curiosity sparks **imagination** and **creative thinking.** Being curious hinges to a great extent on **active listening** and **asking better questions** rather than jumping straight to conclusions.

Learning often involves a large amount of **trial and error** as well as conceptual **reasoning** and **visualization**. Einstein made numerous discoveries that his more technically able colleagues missed due

largely to the fact that his **persistence** and **curiosity** led him to make **more mistakes** and to **learn from these**.

It is through **nurturing** this **sense of curiosity** in learning and in others that children and ourselves are brought into direct contact with **God and His graces**.

I share with you an excerpt from a prayer, which beautifully encapsulates the sacred privilege that we all have as parents and teachers.

Blessed are they who engage not in comparison

of their child with others,

for precious unto each is the rhythm of one's own individuality and growth.

On the Thursday or Sunday after Trinity Sunday, the Church celebrates The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This Feast commemorates the immense gift of the Eucharist in our lives and in the Church.

In Latin, Corpus Christi means Body of Christ. Corpus Christi Sunday allows us to focus solely on celebrating the real presence of Christ – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – in the bread and wine.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith!

Saint John Vianney was right when he said: "If we truly understood the Mass, we would die of joy".

The Eucharist is such a fundamental aspect of our faith but unfortunately, one that we can easily take for granted. ATTENDANCE

CEDP promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.

If your child is sick or absent you are required to notify the school on the first day of absence if at all possible. All explanations to the school must be provided within **7 days** from the first day of any period of absence.

Absences can be explained using one of the following methods:

- 1. Online: log the absence directly using the one-time link that is sent to you via SMS if your child is absent
- 2. Email the school at bethany@parra.catholic.edu.au
- 3. Telephone the school office on 4723 3700
- 4. Note sent with your child

Where an explanation has not been received within the 7 day timeframe or the explanation has not been accepted, the school will record the absence as unexplained or unjustified on the student's record. The school will not be able to accept explanations which are not received within the 7 day timeframe. With the Automated SMS message system in place at Bethany, Unexplained Absence letters will no longer be sent.

Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Parents of children aged 6 to 17 years are legally required to ensure their children attend school every day or provide an explanation if they are absent. Notifying the school and providing an explanation for your child's absence will fulfil this legal responsibility.

The safety and wellbeing of students are the highest priorities for schools. Parents need to know if their child isn't at school, and schools need to know when and why a child is absent. Notifying the school of your child's absence helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of all children in school.

What is your responsibility?

- Ensure your child attends school every day
- Notify the school immediately if your child is absent
- Provide an explanation for any absences within 7 days
- Make sure the school has your correct contact details so that you can receive attendance information about your child
